Hello,

Today marks the beginning of Passiontide. The list of meaning of 'passion' in the dictionary is as follows:

- 1. Intense and barely controllable emotion
- 2. A state or outburst of strong emotion
- 3. Strong sexual love
- 4. The suffering and death of Jesus.

Number 4 is quite a contrast to 1-3. When we speak of Passion Sunday, I suspect most people would have an image related to 1-3, rather than 4. This time of the Church year feels very 'in house' in terms of its meaning – Easter being a far more popularly understood. But that's OK – I think the next few days are a time for serious discipleship – taking this journey to the cross afresh will give spiritual insight to us, and thereby strengthen our resolve for mission and evangelism at Easter and beyond.

THE HIGH ALTAR - A MYSTERY



Many publications describing our Reredos have said that in the niche on the south side of the victory are effigies of St Peter with the keys, and St Paul. I have repeated this without questioning it in the revised short guide I produced a few years ago.

One of the NADFAS team recording the artefacts in our church has drawn attention to the fact that the second figure is holding a scallop shell. This is the undoubted "signature" of St James. There are some publications which have the correct information. So apart from needing to look for opportunities to correct this it would be interesting to ask why St James is included in the figures in the lower tier.

Indeed, why St Hilda, St Catherine, St Joan of Arc, St Mary Magdalene, St James, St Peter St. Hugh, and King David were selected? Some of them have feast days close to St Martin's Day, when the rebuilt east end church was dedicated. Is that sufficient reason?
